


An interdisciplinary field that develops methods and software tools for understanding **biological data**, in particular when the data sets are large and complex.

The Hedge Fund non-compete

Hedge Funds are big employers of STEM talent. Quantitative researchers analyse large, structured and unstructured financial data sets to find signals. Software engineers provide the tools and infrastructure to enable this analysis.

When a quantitative researcher or software engineer leaves a hedge fund, they typically have a 6-24 month paid non-compete period in their employment contract. This means for the duration of their non-compete they are paid their normal salary but not allowed to work for any other financial firms and are effectively inactive.

This is a huge waste of talented minds....



Q - How about if we put this talent pool to work on short term, unpaid, bioinformatic projects ?

Good Leaver is a not-for-profit organisation that provides a platform for STEM-educated professionals to contribute to short-term, volunteer projects across bioinformatic research during their non-compete periods. We were established by Simon Grainger, a leading figure within the hedge fund recruitment world, as a way to give back to the medical research community.



Become a Good Leaver

Good Leaver partners with publicly funded Medical Research Institutions to promote short term, professional volunteering projects. The projects vary but will normally involve the application of advanced statistical modelling and/or engineering to vast, complex structured and unstructured data sets.

Projects are unpaid, conducted onsite or remotely and typically last from 3 - 6 months.

Biostatistics or medical research experience is not necessary however these are highly technical projects that require advanced graduate-level education in a STEM discipline and practical experience working with very large datasets.
